Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **Kamdhenu Jeevandhara Foundation** ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at March 31,2022, the statement of income and expenditure for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31,2022, and Deficit for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the financial statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those SAs are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with the independence requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical independent responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on financial statements.

Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Management and Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. The other information is expected to be made available to us after the date of this Auditor report.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's management and Board of Directors are responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management and Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. NOTES ON FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2022

1 Corporate Information

Kamdhenu Jeevandhara Foundation was incorporated on 14.11.2019 under section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013. The company is primarily engaged in the following activities on Non-profit basis:

To carry on Education and Vocational training, Health care, Relief of Poor, Medical relief, Preservation of environment (including watersheds, forest and wildlife), and the doing of all such other lawful things as considered necessary for the furtherance of the above objectives.

2 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Accounting

These financial statements have been prepared under historical cost convention from books of accounts maintained on an accrual basis (unless otherwise stated hereinafter) in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India and comply with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and referred to Sec 129 & 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, of India. The accounting policies applied by the company are consistent with those used in previous year.

b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make certain estimates and assumptions that affect the amount reported in the financial statement and notes thereto. Differences between actual and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialized.

c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in handand short term bank deposits, if any with original maturity of three months or less.

d) Recognition of Income & Expenditure

All the items of costs/expenditure and revenue/ income have been accounted for on accural basis.

e) Property Plant & Equipment:

Property Plant & Euipments are recorded on historical cost and all expenses till the assets is ready for put to use are capitalized.

f) Depreciation on Property Plant and Equipment is provided over the useful life of assets as specified in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013 using straight line method. Property Plant and Equipment which are added / disposed off during the year, depreciation is provided on pro rata basis with reference to the month of addition/ deletion.
